

Questions and Answer for RFP – RAPP Cambodia Aquaculture

Q: What contract structure does ASA/WISHH intend to issue for this engagement?

A: There will be annual contracts that will reflect the activities for that given year.

Q: Beyond personnel time, what costs (such as those related to event hosting) does ASA/WISHH anticipate the implementer to incur during the course of this assignment or to include in the cost proposal?

A: All meeting, travel and other activity expenses will be reimbursable on approved and actual costs. These costs do not need to be included in this proposal.

Q: Can ASA/WISHH provide an estimate for the level of effort anticipated under this scope of work over the life of the assignment?

A: The level of effort will depend on the activities for that given year. Activities may include in-person regional training and educational events, attendance and promotion of Cambodian aquaculture at World Aquaculture Society (WAS) conferences and meetings, hosting in-country discussions focused on strengthening the aquaculture value chains with local stakeholders, organizing technical consultant visits, arranging trade team travel to regional and global aquaculture conferences, along with providing administrative support including report writing, submitting compliant receipts and distributing surveys to activity participants.
